



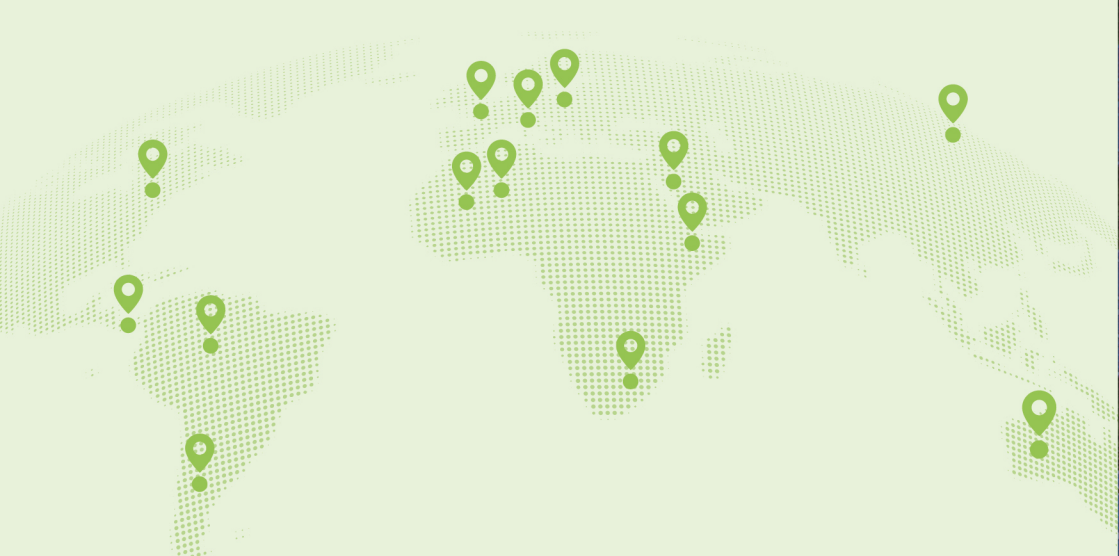

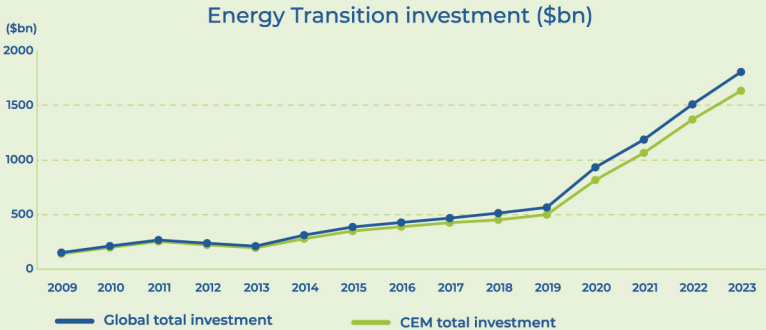

For 15 years, the CEM has brought together the most ambitious governments and energy actors to push towards clean energy.

There is a lot of work left to do for the world to hit its net-zero targets. As the first high-level platform designed specifically to address clean energy issues, the CEM is poised to further accelerate the pace of the clean energy transition.

A BOTTOM-UP, COLLABORATIVE APPROACH

Our projects are created and led by our multidisciplinary, cross-sector community of experts. This ensures that they efficiently and thoroughly address the most pressing energy issues of the day.

The CEM operates in two dimensions to ensure our members have the greatest impact:



Annual Ministerial meeting

Provides political guidance from Energy Ministers on priority outcomes and helps to mobilise resources for action.



Year-round technical initiatives and campaigns

Tasked with implementing the actions needed to address the most pressing clean energy challenges.

80%

of the future global hydrogen market have declared intent on clean hydrogen certification schemes at COP28 as a result of the CEM International Hydrogen Trade Forum (IHTF).



81%

of all light sources are projected to be LED by 2030. Supported by the CEM Global Lighting Challenge campaign (2015).



210

signatories worldwide (2018) are committed to inclusive energy transitions through the Equalby30 campaign (EB30) thanks to CEM.



16%

of all greenhouse emissions come from the production of steel, cement and concrete. At COP28, the world's largest purchasers of steel and concrete for public construction projects signed onto the CEM IDDI Green Public Procurement Pledge (2023).



28

countries, including non-CEM members, have enhanced their strategic energy policymaking thanks to the CEM's LTES initiative. This notably helps Brazil to optimise its renewable energy infrastructure.



30%

of electric vehicles are predicted to be sold by 2027. Thanks to the joint government-industry signals sent by the EV30@30 campaign. When CEM members' EV30@30 campaign first launched, **only 1% of all vehicles sold were electric.**

ACHIEVING NET-ZERO

To achieve net-zero, everyone needs to be involved in adopting clean energy technologies. The CEM is focused on increasing participation from **the global south, youth, and other underrepresented groups** in the energy sector through initiatives like the Equality in Energy Transitions Initiative and the Empowering People Initiative.

The CEM brings together public, private, and civil society actors from all parts of the energy sector to address challenges in a coordinated way. By fostering collaboration across different sectors, the CEM ensures that all participants can contribute to and benefit from solutions to energy deployment challenges. This approach helps maximise value and ensures that efforts are aligned for more effective outcomes.

The CEM is committed to providing actionable plans for accelerating the energy transition and aligning these efforts with both member countries' priorities and global energy goals. By connecting clean energy stakeholders with governments, **the CEM helps implement concrete actions to tackle energy challenges and drive the shift towards a sustainable energy future.**
